Old Business

Issues with Community Run Centres – Arden Wolitski has talked to everyone about not being happy about paying the “administration fees”. It was pointed out that the centres get a YBC manual, a Club 55+ manual and they can enter tournaments among other perks if they are to become members of the Bowl Sask.

Sunshine Bowlers – Glencairn and Rosetown are running this program in their centres.

Telephone Survey – There is a short survey being done by phone or you can do it online.

Pin Bottoms – If you put the bottoms on before October 1 then you are considered a trial house. The C5 requested year end averages compared to end of Dec averages this year to do a comparison. The Golden Mile has bases that are worn down on one side from a result of a bad batch of bases; otherwise the averages are up and the open play customers are happy.

Constitution – We went over the changes that need to be made to the Constitution. There is a sheet of changes to go along with your copy of the Constitution.

National Classified – Carrie Harper will look after getting 4 x 6 plaques ordered to the hi games at the National Classified at a cost of \$12 each x 18 plaques = \$216.00.

New Business

Registration of non affiliated bowlers – You can do this on line at Bowl Canada. They want to have names and postal codes of all of the bowlers that are not in regular leagues so they have a better number of how many bowlers there are. Bowlers can not already be registered with C5 or C10 or any Bowl Canada leagues.

Knock Down Cancer Event – Discussion was made as to what each centre was doing for this occasion. We will do a press release. Bowl Canada will send out a press release for us to us as well as banners etc. We could another year raise awareness for a cause as a whole group (towards kids) – one day province wide give shoe rental to a cause; like Time Horton's with their day camp and Dairy Queen with their blizzard days. Suggestions were made as to other causes we could support but for now we are committed through Bowl Canada to Knock Down Cancer.

The new date for our Annual Meeting is June 23 & 24, 2012 in Moose Jaw at the Heritage Hotel; rooms start at \$106.00.

Break for lunch at 12:10 pm. Meeting started again at 12:45 pm.

Some hosting reports were handed in for the upcoming tournaments.

Motion: Shirley Bird / Rick Hunter that the 10 Pin Youth Doubles will match the hi average bowler with the low average bowler without separating into divisions. **Carried**

Motion: Shirley Bird / Rick Hunter that no metals be presented for the 10 Pin World Cup Tournament. **Carried**

Good and Welfare

Carla Larson brought up that she would like for her bowlers not to have to drive 4 hours to bowl in the Classified Zones. She will be in the Yorkton Zone which is only 2 1/2 hours away. Carla Larson stated her unhappiness with losing the position of being the YBC representative in her zone. She is happy with Moose Jaw being the new YBC zone representative.

Golden Mile and Eastview are very happy with “The Kids Bowl Free” program, it brought alot of kids and families into their centres this summer which equals increased revenue.

**EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR REPORT
BOWL SASK SEMI-ANNUAL MEETING
OCTOBER 30TH, 2011**

Bowling Federation: The Board of Directors and I have been extremely busy this season. We held our Annual General Meeting September 10th, at which time Dave Shepherd was elected Treasurer. Sask Lotteries funding levels have increased substantially, 16% for this fiscal year and 11% next year.

I also addressed a number of concerns re adequate reporting of membership numbers, age classifications, tournament participation numbers, etc. by our member organizations. All of you will need to assist in recording the data required by Sask Sport, Mary Cunningham has all the information you need to assist her. Should you have any questions re the correct recording of this data please contact me at the Federation office.

The following day we held our three year strategic planning session.

Number one priority time and again is declining membership specifically in rural communities. To address this issue visitation will be made to a number of rural centres to identify their needs and encourage them to affiliate. Your Executive as well as Federation members have been hard at work behind the scenes trying to address this issue and are researching solutions. Bowl Sask and the Federation exist to serve our membership and we value your ideas and concerns all input is welcome to assist us with providing you with the tools to operate a successful bowling centre and run successful programs and leagues.

On October 15th we held our last LTAD (Long Term Athlete Development) implementation planning session and have identified a number of gaps in our current sport delivery system. The plan should be completed in the month of December after which it will be presented to the Federation Board of Directors for approval I want to thank all who participated and provided valuable input into the formation of the plan. The plan will be posted on our web site as well as introduced at all member organizations meetings in the spring. Implementation of the LTAD will begin in the 2012 season.

Police Checks: I want to thank all of you who have so diligently been keeping on top of your volunteers working with youth to ensure their police checks have been completed and submitted to the Federation office.

BOWL SASK FINANCES

The audited financial statements are the same as I presented in June so if there are no questions on them - can someone move that they be adopted as presented? Just a note - these statements are available on the website but I feel they need to be presented here to be passed by the members. This coming year we need to adjust that - the audits are supposed to be passed within 90 days of year-end so we need a motion to allow the five executive members - President, Vice-President, Past-President, Secretary and Treasurer to vote and pass them within the required time frame. Since this is a constitution change the motion should be made here but cannot be voted on until the June meeting.

The format of the audited statements will also be changing to conform to Sask Sports guidelines for reporting annual finances. This will not alter my June meeting reports as I feel it is very important to examine the income and expense of each tournament as a whole rather than have a separate section for all expenses and all income.

This appears to be year of changes: The Bowlers Affiliation form has changed - we require a list of the non-affiliated bowlers along with number of females and males. A league roster sheet or list will suffice.

The really big change is going to be the billing date for 2012-13 season - when I took over doing the books I followed what Greg had done. Apparently we were supposed to have our Bowl Canada Dues in by April 1st. Since they are considering charging late fees we will have to adjust the due date on our invoices to March 15th to give me time to send the funds into Bowl Canada. This means that I will be sending them out the beginning of February. We need to impress upon Bowl Canada that since their year-end is not until July 31st, they should adjust this due date.

Now to the Financial statements:

Balance Sheet - We currently have 34 members - with Ponteix (thanks to Dennis Brooks) renewing we will be at 35 members. It is great to have Hudson Bay back in as they are very active in the majority of our programs.

Our bank balance is great - I keep the profits from last year in the bank until year-end for cash flow purposes. Should be able to buy another term in May. The prepaid expenses are pins but I need to make a major adjustment on this amount since we don't have any left!! Somehow, the amount that I was deducting each year was way under the actual number of pins being used - my apologies for that error. The accts/rec consist of dues from Hudson Bay (received), Ponteix and a small amt from Sask YBC as well as a GST Rebate.

The deferred revenue is the Ponteix dues.

Income Statement - on this statement I have entered estimates to see how I think things will go for this year. Last year we had a profit of \$6000.00 but I don't think that for this year we will be able to reach that high - having a profit at all is great. Some changes - the MAP Grant for the Club 55+ went up by \$1000 so that will help offset expenses for their tournaments. Since the triples is being held in Saskatoon the travel costs will greatly increase as most of the teams are from the south.

Our conference expenses will be higher this year but we also show a marked increase in sponsor fees and administration fees which help to offset these costs as well as the cost of running Bowl Sask. As instructed I am now on the internet - managed to get a deal - \$15.00/mo for the first six months and then to around \$30.00. Just have to get used to dealing with up to 11 e-mails a day.

SASK YOUTH BOWLING

The audited financial statements are the same as I presented in June so if there are no questions on them - can someone move that they be adopted as presented?

We have some changes with the YBC as well. This year we obtained an extra \$5000.00 in MAP funds which we decided to use to promote the YBC programs and encourage the development of our athletes by covering some costs of practice sessions. To this end I have distributed an expense claim - MAP Expense Claim Form - for each center to submit lineage costs for practices from Dec 1st (Singles) to Feb 15th. It is very important that the practices are itemized into the age divisions and that male or female counts are given. - Monies should be recorded for each division separately. The grant will be distributed on a pro-rated basis so all expense claims must be rec'd by Feb 28th (29th?).

This year the executive has had a number of requests for assistance from existing members and from non-members. To date Shirley Bird and I have visited Allan and Perdue to acquaint them with the way to enter YBC tournaments and get more involved with the programs. We also went to Outlook - Dara, the manager, is a very enthusiastic individual who really wants to upgrade their center and join our association. She will need help with info, etc. but hopefully her board will be receptive to her needs. When we do these visits we also promote Club 55+ and the 5-Pin Assoc.

Now for the Financial Statements:

Balance Sheet - We are doing well in the savings but I will have to reduce that somewhat in order to cover the expense claims before I can submit them for re-imburement. The inventory consists of a two year supply of the National bags that we give to the 4-steps contingent.

The Accts/rec is the amount owing from the hosting committee of the 2011 YBC nationals - Kyle tells me that that amount will be greatly increased. The Accts/Pay consists of \$200.00 to Bowl Sask and \$662.00 to Shelley for Bowl Canada Annual Mtg expenses - I'm waiting for the Canadian dollar amt.

Income Statement

As with the Bowl Sask statements, I have tried to estimate what will occur this year. You will see that the MAP grant increase is listed. As well, we have an increase in the excellence and participation grants. This is mainly due to the fact we are travelling to Nfld this year. It also means that the National Assessment will be back in place - \$50.00 per YBC Bowler travelling to the Nationals.

On the expense side the travel to Nfld will probably cost us a lot more - this is difficult to estimate.

That is the only major increase and we will have to cash in some term deposits to cover the loss.

We will still be in great financial shape for future years.

BOWL SASK PRESIDENT'S REPORT

OCTOBER 30TH 2011

Hello everyone. I hope everyone had a good summer and are now back to the business of bowling.

We were not off to a positive start this season we had 5 centres not renew for the 2011-2012 season. Gull Lake, Pontix, Watrous and Wishart are not renewing. I haven't heard from Weyburn as of yet. I have phoned Len to ask him to give me an update but at the time of preparing this report I don't know what Weyburn's position is I presume they are not renewing with Bowl Sask. On a positive note Hudson Bay is back. They should be open for business again in November. Also we have had 5 centres contact us showing interest in Bowl Sask. Outlook, Aberdeen, Perdue, Allen and Borden. Mary Cunningham and Shirley Bird have been to visit Outlook and Perdue. Dave Shepherd has been to visit Jansen and they are possibly interested in becoming members again. Aberdeen was more interested in us sending bowlers to their centre to bowl. Mary has spoken to Allen and Borden and offered assistance. Thanks very much to the three of you for going to these centres.

I hope everyone was able to access the minutes on the website. Thanks to Phil Robinson for making this possible. Our minutes and financial statement are now on the Sask Bowl website. All organizations are to have their financial statement on the site so each group is "transparent".

At our Bowl Canada AGM in Dallas we passed the following:

- We will implement a Bowl Canada registration card to capture all regular bowling customers bowling in organized leagues who are not affiliated with CTF, C5 or any Bowl Canada programs, with the objective of satisfying BFC's strategic Plan requirements.
- Commencing with the 2011-2012 season all YBC coaches in The Scratch team Event of 4 Steps to Stardom must have attained their Community Coach certificate (or equivalent) by the date of the Nationals. Additionally the same rule apply to all the Combo Team coaches effective for the 2012-2013 season. In all cases where a coach is not duly certified the Provincial YBC shall appoint a duly certified coach as a replacement.
- Hosting schedule for YBC Nationals: 2012 Nfld, 2013 BC, 2014 N. Ont and 2015 Man. Where 10Pin host centres are not available in the selected locations Bowl Canada Office will select an appropriate host for a separate 10 Pin National.
- It was decided to support The Knock Down Cancer Campaign. The campaign will run in Jan. Some centres are setting up an actual tournament with the proceeds going to Knock Down Cancer and some centres are donating 25 cents from each shoe rental to Knock Down Cancer. Pink shoes were available for purchase in Sept. As well as balloons, tee shirts and other promo items. Hopefully it will be a big success.

Some Centres in Saskatchewan have the new pins bases installed. The C5 has asked for the centres last year averages and we are to supply our bowler's averages at the end of Dec. this year so a comparison may be made and a decision made as to the certification of these bottoms.

As of today, we have held one Intro to Competition (10) and 3 Community Coach Clinics (19), with 6 people taking the Ethics for Level I upgrading. We will be holding 1 more Community Coach in Rosetown on November 5 and 1 more Intro to Competition will be held in Regina on November 25 – 27. If you have people interested in taking these clinics please call Heather Lawrence at 306-864-3335 with names and numbers of the people wanting to take the clinic. Heather will actually contact the person direct to make sure they are attending the proper clinic. Or if the numbers are good in one area, she will arrange to hold a clinic there.

The minimum for the Intro to Competition is 6 people, we do pay some expenses for this clinic, ie: hotel (one night) and mileage. This is a three day clinic.
