Teaching Division Singles:

National MBAC wants to have a stepladder for the Teaching Division Singles at Nationals. The top three men and women singles would play in a stepladder at the same time as the Tournament Division Singles. If passed at the MBAC meeting in July 2011, this new Teaching Division Singles format would be put in place at the 2012 Nationals in Newfoundland.

Provincial Practice:

There was a choice of having a provincial practice in Saskatchewan or using the money to fly to Ottawa a day early which would enable all the teams to practice there. It was decided that there will be a provincial practice, however,

no travel costs will be covered and the money will be used to fly to Ottawa a day early.

That D (a) of the Tournament Manual be amended to read:

To qualify for a National Team, a bowler or coach must:

- I) participate in one or more of the events sanctioned by the MBAS, such as, but not limited to, current Master/YBC tournaments - zones and/or Provincials, mentorship leagues, Master/Youth tournaments, Bowling School, Learn to Bowl Clinics for Youth (20 and under); or*
- II) If they are not able to participate in any of the sanctioned events in I) above, pay a fee of \$25.00 to the MBAS by February 1st.*

To gain consideration for sanction, application must be made to the fall Executive Meeting of each year.

TEACHING DIVISION REPORT March 18, 2011

Congratulations to Lonny Ackers and the teaching ladies on their medal wins in Sudbury.

The teaching division have 12 new members joining us this year which is good to see, but we also lost a number of bowlers, so our numbers are not really increasing which is sad to see.

It seems the prize money offered has brought new members in but the perceived high cost of bowling in the masters has kept a number of former and possible new recruits away.

Concerns that I have myself or I have heard from teaching division members that I have canvassed are.

1. I have great concerns about our recent infatuation with voting over the internet, i.e. Vote on the question of a provincial practice or flying out a day early. No discussion just either or.

It was my understanding that in the past a provincial practice was necessary in May because we got grant money to be used for that purpose and it had to be used up by the end of May or we lost it.

What has changed with that?

2. The consensus of the people I've talked to is that it is unfair to have members who have made the contingent sell elimination tickets and to have to pay their assessment fees at the banquet.

Those people on a tight budget do not have the resources to come up with \$500 or \$600 on the spur of the moment, without knowing ahead of time how much they will need, and time to save for it.

The issue of elimination tickets, it is felt that if more money is needed to send the contingent to nationals then we need to increase our entry fees, all people who enter the tournaments in Nov. have an equal shot at making the team, so all should be willing to cover the cost. With elimination tickets you are basically penalizing the winners for winning.

3. In the Jan. newsletter you also say the new constitution and Duties and responsibilities manual are to be voted on at the A.G.M. after it has been reviewed online but if it was put on there

all of the people I talked to couldn't find it so how are they expected in good conscious to vote on it.

4. It is felt that the Master/YBC north is on its deathbed; other than 1 team from Swift Current and 5 teams from Rosetown only Saskatoon participated.

5. I am unhappy with your decision to not go along with the proposal to add the teaching division singles as its own entity, as in the tournament division, seeing as in 9 years out of 10 it is the teaching division that pays the way. The stepladder is at least a step in the right direction.

6. Finally the brochures that were put out in the alleys, I don't think they have done the job we had hoped for as I have seen none taken out of the houses I have frequented.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR REPORT MASTER BOWLERS ASSOCIATION OF SASKATCHEWAN ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING MARCH 19TH, 2011

Sask Sport/Sask Lotteries:

To meet the requirements of Sask Sport accurate numbers and documentation for all programs and services provided by the MBAS are required.

Information needed is:

Actual tournament participation numbers at all levels. Includes local, zone, and provincial levels of competition. Also ages of participants within the Sask Sport age blocks and number of male/female participants. Coaching clinic information is also required.

Audited financial statements must be presented and approved no later than 120 days after year end.

Dispute Resolution Policy must be adopted as well

The Provincial Government's expectations and policies that address the citizens of the Province of Saskatchewan include participation for as many citizens as possible. As the demographics and future demographics indicate the increasing number of aboriginal citizens it is important to include programming and formulate partnerships to increase participation of aboriginals within our sport.

I have applied for an exceptional needs grant on behalf of the Bowling Federation and approval sounds promising. The grant would be to hire two persons (one for the north half of the province and one for the south half) to contact and assess the needs of local bowling centres/local associations affiliated and non-affiliated. Once assessment is performed visitations will be made to the centres to promote programs and services offered by the Bowling Federation and its member organizations as well as to assist with education/knowledge re administration and to provide coaching information sessions, learn to bowl clinics, etc. Final outcome of this project is to register more members, improve communication and provide rural communities with the assistance they need in operating successful bowling programs and services.

LTAD: The Federation received approval for the LTAD Implementation Grant. Our first session was held March 13th. We have a lot of work ahead of us and our next session will be held in May.

2.

Federation Update: Rick Hunter was elected president at the Annual General Meeting in October. I met with Rick in December and took Jack Tait and his wife Lottie out for supper. I presented Jack with a clock for his twenty years of service to the Bowling Federation.

The Federation held a Board of Director's meeting in early January. Funding for the 2011/2012 and 2012/2013 fiscal years were allocated. Both the MBAS and S5PBA are traveling to Quebec and Newfoundland in the same fiscal years.

Has been extremely busy this year and will continue to be with two National Championships being held in Regina as well as the LTAD Implementation Planning process and the changes to the Non Profit Corporations act to be implemented prior to the start of next season.

Fundraising Coordinator Report
March 18, 2011

To date we have collected \$550 in 50/50 monies, this will be added to with this weekend's sales. We will also be selling Backwards Bingo cards throughout the tournament weekend.

The 50/50 sales at the North and South Master/YBC Provincials ended up paying for the prize money in both areas, with no extra left over. This was a large decrease from last year's sales.

The Grey Cup/Superbowl sales this year were quite disappointing. Feedback from most buyers was that they really enjoyed the idea of having the Superbowl on the same ticket and that they were being sold for the same price as other tickets, but for two games. Areas that sold out of their allotments last year did not this year, and those that were short last year, sold out this year.

The Grey Cup saw a payout of only two winners in the sold tickets, where the winning scores for the Superbowl were all on sold tickets. A possible 3758 tickets could have been sold in total. The final results were as follows:

Grey Cup Sold – 2250 tickets
 - \$4500
Superbowl Sold – 372
 - \$372

Sales Total: \$4872.00
Prize Payout: -1275.00
Printing: -473.00
Licensing: -20.00

Total Profit: \$3104.00

Total possible profit had all the tickets sold before the Grey Cup: \$5023, theoretical loss of (\$1919.00).

These monies are to be used to pay for the Master/YBC Provincials so that we can allocate those expenses elsewhere. This year the Provincials cost:

Lineage: \$2640.00
Per Diem: \$1150.00
Medals: \$54.00

Total Expenses: \$3844.00

There was \$1015 collected in entry fees this year, had we sold out before the Grey Cup game we would have had \$4859 to move to cover other expenses this year. As it is, we are able to reallocate \$3379 to other areas.

If we do not continue with the Grey Cup sales then the Masters are looking at a yearly cost of approximately \$4000 instead of a decrease in expenses. Why would we not continue with the sale of these tickets? There are two reasons:

A commitment from the zone reps that they will make every effort to distribute the tickets to people who will actually try and sell them, and that they will track this distribution is needed. This is a large job, and the coordinator does not have the ability to be in contact with each member, which is the benefit of having zone reps. It is not only your regular members that need to be approached, but the associates that are a great resource as well. If there is no commitment today from the zone reps that they will properly track the tickets, distribute the tickets, collect the tickets to return to the coordinator, then there is no point in going forward with this project in the fall.

The other reason the ticket sales may not happen, is that there is a rumor going around that a motion will be put forward to remove the qualifying participation element for making a National contingent. If this happens and we lose the Master/YBC tournament, then there is no justification for a license and that money will be gone. One may say, well so will the expense, but there is also income from this in the form of registrations, as well as the benefit of the youth learning about the Masters and perhaps joining one day.

I truly hope that we continue with all elements of this program. However, we could put through a motion at the AGM, that if people would rather not fundraise, then we can increase the fundraising fee. If you look at the income from the Grey Cup/Superbowl of \$3104 and divide that by this year's membership of, I am guessing 150, the fee would have been increased by \$21 per person to make up for that money.

The first scheduled Poker tournament was cancelled due to lack of response from the membership. The second one will only go forward if the winning contingent members agree to sell the tickets to help offset their assessments.

Technical Report

We are moving towards our first Intro to Competition Clinic. I know Heather has been working on the organization of these for the past two months.

I have been trying to find out from the C5 what exactly the process of taking the Intro to Competition is and also the upgrade of our current Level II's.

Let us start with the Intro to Competition. If you take the full course at a cost of \$175.00, this will give you the course, with the exception of the evaluation which will take place three months after. You will be required to take this evaluation before your course is considered complete with the C5. We have not had a discussion as of yet to decide if you are to contact myself, the clinician, or the C5 to arrange your evaluation.

To complete your Level II, you will need to take the online version of the MED. First you will need to apply to the NCCP for a password, (which they forward to the C5 office for verification that you are qualified to take the online MED). They will send you a password and then you proceed to take the MED. If you fail you will be required to take the Intro to Competition clinic. If you pass the Intro to Competition MED online, you must send in notice to the C5 office, so your C5 record will show that you are qualified as a coach.

Hopefully I will be able to simplify this over the course of time.

I have handed out to your zone reps updated lists of the Technical List. They also have received the certificate from the C5 for the Community Coach Clinics that were taken.
