MBAS Report

Sask 5 – Sept 2025

We held our SAGM meeting in Regina on the third weekend in March; the VP Position was up, and Ellen Griffin is in for another 2-year term effective August 1, 2025.

The MBAS contingent attended the 2025 MBAC Nationals in Surrey, B.C. from June 22nd to June 27th. Saskatchewan contingent was very focused on results and I am proud to say they were very successful on the lanes. To brag our very own Josie Brooks brought home the Tournament Women Singles Gold for the 2nd time in 3 years, Justin Vansil our Tournament Men's Single was oh so close and placed 4th; 1 match away from the top 3. Teaching Women's Team came in fourth; Dianne Misener one of the teaching women won seventeen out of her twenty-one matches and tied for most wins in her category and she came in first bowling 696 pins over average which earned her a spot on Team Canada. The Teaching Men's team captured the Gold Medal with 126.5 points which was a record for total points in their Teaching Men's division. Tyler Goosen, the Teaching Men's Single earned a bronze medal; 1 point out of 1st place and continuing in the Teaching Men's division, Jason Raschke (bowling with left hand) won 18 of 21 of his matches and winning most matches in his division plus top POA points of 588 which earned him a spot on Team Canada. Our Senior Team captured the bronze medal in their division; it was a grind to the end. Oh, and not to leave our coaches out, Orest Shular, coach of the Teaching Men earned the coaches spot on Team Canada for coaching his team to the highest POA total out of the Teaching Men, Teaching Women and Senior Team Divisions. Our Tournament Men and Women's teams struggled early but never gave up.

Our 2024-2025 membership numbers were up a bit from the 2023-2024 season; it was nice to see a record number of new younger members take part this year and the successes they had with the Master's.

I am happy to report that the MBAS Audit of Financial Statements for the 2024-25 season is complete and will be available on our website soon. The MBAS is presently in a good financial position.

As of March 2025, Saskatchewan has 585. As mentioned before please go to the website at www.saskbowl.com under the coaching tab regarding info on becoming a coach; how to let us know you are interested in becoming a coach. There is a Community Coach Clinic in Regina today and a few Introductions to Competition courses are in the planning stages; one in October in Saskatoon and one in Regina in November.

I wanted to address a few inquiries regarding coaching I have received recently; firstly, you do need at least a Community Coach status with your Respect In Sport certificate to coach youth and adults and secondly, there are some Nationals in which a Community Coach can coach at and don't require a Competition Competitive Coach.

"Coming Soon" but not effective currently, the Make Ethical Decisions piece will be taken out of the Community Coach Clinic. When it becomes effective, prior to taking the Community Coach Clinic, participants will need to not only take their RIS online with Sask Sport (free) but also the Make Ethical Decisions course on Coach Canada Locker at a cost of \$80.00.

It is National Coach week, and it is all about recognizing the incredible impact coaches have on each level of sport and their incredible passion and dedication. "Thanks Coach"

The 2025-2026 MBAC Nationals are being Hamilton/Burlington at the end of June 2026.

The MBAS will be hosting the 2027 MBAC Nationals in Regina from June 27^{th,} being early arrivals to July 3rd being departure date. We have a good start on forming our Host Committee. Thank you to Jeff Hiibner for introducing our Association to Stay In Regina rep Raynelle. We have accepted a proposal offer worth \$32,500.00 Cash In Hand worth of Funding from the Regina Hotel Association, City of Regina and Sask Tourism.

Bowling Federation of Saskatchewan Report:

As you are probably aware by now, Rhonda is no longer the Executive Director of the Bowling Federation of Saskatchewan. Rhonda was terminated, with cause, on July 5, 2025. Since this affects all of the Member Organizations, we thought you should all be aware of some of the circumstances surrounding her termination and the sad fact that she came close to single-handedly destroying the Federation and jeopardizing the funding for each of your organizations.

The Federation Executive and Board have always put their trust in Rhonda to perform her duties and responsibilities in order to ensure that Sask. Sport funding was available for the benefit of the Member Organizations. We learned the hard way that Rhonda was not performing her duties and responsibilities for most of the past two years while she continued to assure us that she was handling matters.

Dealing with Sask. Sport is a crucial component of the Executive Director's job as well as communicating effectively with the Member Organizations that rely heavily on the Federation for funding.

Rhonda has been denied access to Mosaic and the Federation office. All passwords have been changed so she cannot access email, bank or Sask. Sport. The Federation laptop has been returned and the password has been changed.

It is also hard to believe that someone would use the Federation business email address for personal use such as dating sites, sex related sites, groceries and travel sites to name a few, there were many others.

We are now desperately trying to get the Federation back on track so that your future funding is not in jeopardy. Sask. Sport has been a tremendous help to me and Moe in this endeavour and we are very grateful that they are allowing the Federation to get back on track without serious consequences.

We discovered that the Bowling Federation of Saskatchewan Non-Profit corporation status was struck from the ISC register for failure to file the Annual Return on time which automatically put all Sask. Sport funding in jeopardy and on hold since it is mandatory that the Federation be a registered Non-Profit corporation in good standing in order to receive Sask. Lotteries funding. The Federation has now been

restored as a Non-Profit corporation in good standing and Sask. Sport has accepted the restoral.

The Police Check database was not up to date or recorded properly pursuant to the Sask. Sport Safe Sport Policy. I will be providing a separate report on the Police Check policy and database.

We are finding that Rhonda did not communicate effectively with the Member Organizations with respect to issues and concerns expressed by Sask. Sport. We are now rectifying those issues and concerns and correcting mistakes so you will see, starting in the 2025-2026 fiscal year, some reporting changes that will be implemented for the Member Organizations.

The audit for the 2023-2024 fiscal year was not done. The bank reconciliations had not been done either. Moe and I did the best we could to prepare the documentation for the auditor and the 2023-2024 audit was completed in July, 2025. The Follow Up report for 2023-2024 has been completed as well, however, some funding is still on hold pending completion of the 2023-2024 mandatory review by the Sask. Sport Lotteries Trust Fund people due to the failure to comply with funding guidelines. We hope to receive this back funding in October, 2025.

As a result of the 2023-2024 review still in progress, we are not yet allowed to submit any funding applications for the 2025-2026 fiscal year.

Also, as a result of the back funding not being received, we are not in a position at this time to pay anything from the Federation and we would appreciate your patience and understanding in this regard.

Moe and I are now in the process of gathering the information that we need for the 2024-2025 Sask. Sport Follow Up report which is due November 1, 2025. The 2024-2025 Federation audit is now complete as well.

The good news is that we welcome Crystal Hilbner as the new Executive Director on a part-time basis which commenced on September 16, 2025.

Moe and I have spent the last two days with Crystal and we can tell you that she is sufficiently overwhelmed but is looking forward to learning and getting to know all of you. We have assured Crystal that we are all here to support her and she can reach out to any of us at any time as she navigates through this learning process.
